Happy New Year to each one of you!

May we all remember as we go though this New Year that God is with us, and He will continue to be with us through the valleys and through top mountain experiences of our lives. We Are Not Alone. Betty and I lost our nephew who died at the age of 37. He was like our own son. We can still hear God and feel his presence through this painful experience. Once again, we are not alone.

I would like to borrow Henry Nouwen's thoughts. He says, "God came to us because he wanted to journey with us on this road, to listen to our story, and to help us realize that we are not walking in circles but moving toward the house of peace and joy." This is the great mystery of Christmas that continues to give us comfort and consolation: we are not alone on our journey. The God of love who gave us life sent his only Son to be always with us and in all places, so that we never have to feel lost in our struggles but always can trust that he walks with us. We will go through difficult times this year, but God is with us because the Son who was born is "Emmanuel."

The challenge is to let God be who He is and who He would like to be. A part of us clings to our aloneness and does not allow God to touch us where we are most in pain. Often, we hide from him precisely those places in ourselves where

Christmas is the renewed invitation not to be afraid and to let him—whose love is greater than our own hearts and minds can comprehend—be our companion.
Christmas is not a one-day deal. It is rather a season. We are still celebrating Christmas.

Your pastor also gives you a promise to walk with you. I will be praying for your whole family throughout 2024. I hold each one of you in my heart. I care about you. May we continue to know Jesus Christ and to make him known. May we be known as the people who love one another. Connect with each other. Pray for one another. Care for your community. Share the Good News with everyone.


PRAYER FOR THE SICK


New Books:



"The Rent Collector" by Camron Wright. Survival for Ki Lim and Sang Lu is a daily battle at Meanchey, the largest municipal waste dump in all of Cambodia. They make their living scavenging recyclables from the trash. Life would be hard enough without the worry of their chronically ill child, Nisay, and the added expense of medicines that are not working. Just when things seem worst, Sang Lu learns a secret about the ill-tempered woman they call the "the rent collector" who comes each month demanding money—a secret that dates back to the Khmer Rouge and sets in motion a tide that will change the life of everyone it sweeps past. "The Rent Collector" powerfully illustrates how literacy can change lives and how anyone can rise from the ashes in the most unlikely of places. This book is a multiple award winner and the author of international bestseller.

BASKETBALL HOOP

The Youth of our Church meet regularly and are always looking for activities to enhance their fellowship. The Family Life Center includes ample space for indoor activities including basketball hoops. But in the summer time there was really no place or equipment to take those activities outdoors. The youth groups have held fund raisers over the past few years and requested that some or all of that money go towards the purchase and installation of a basketball hoop outdoors. The request was made to the Trustees and finally a new basketball hoop was installed on the west end of our south parking lot. The project was funded in part by the money raised by the youth groups with a major contribution by Clyde and Marsha Krause. MidAmerican Energy donated equipment and manpower to assist with the construction of the foundation for the basketball standard and Smith Concrete provided the concrete for setting the anchor bolts and finishing off the base of the equipment. Finally, the Church Trustees erected the equipment in late November. A big Thank You to all who participated in this project. The equipment is available for Church members and others who are inclined to boost their basketball skills.


