# Pastor's Pen



Greetings in the strong name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

I am writing this message with a heavy heart because of what has been going on around the world (Russians against Ukrainians,

Palestinians against Israelis, and other natural calamities). Please join me as I join Habakkuk to lament with him.

"How long, LORD, must I call for help, but you do not listen? Or cry out to you, "Violence!" but you do not save? Why do you make me look at injustice? Why do you tolerate wrongdoing? Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife. and conflict abounds." (Habakkuk 1:2-3) Who is Habakkuk? Habakkuk is one of the minor prophets. Almost nothing is known about Habakkuk, aside from what is stated within the book of the Bible bearing his name, or those inferences that may be drawn from that book. His name appears in the Bible only in Habakkuk 1:1 and 3:1, with no biographical details provided other than his title "the prophet". Even the origin of his name is uncertain.

For almost every other prophet, more information is given, such as the name of the prophet's hometown, his occupation, or information concerning his parentage or tribe. For Habakkuk, however, there is no reliable account of any of these. Although his home is not identified, scholars conclude that Habakkuk lived in Jerusalem at the time he wrote his prophecy. Further analysis has provided an approximate date for his prophecy and possibilities concerning his activities and background.

Beyond the Bible, considerable conjecture has been put forward over the centuries in the form of Christian and Rabbinic traditions, but such accounts are dismissed by modern scholars as speculative and apocryphal. Because the book of Habakkuk consists of five oracles about the Chaldeans (Babylonians), and the Chaldean rise to power is dated circa 612 BC, it is assumed he was active about that time, making him an early contemporary of Jeremiah and Zephaniah. Jewish sources, however, do not group him with those two prophets, who are often placed together, so it is possible that he was slightly earlier than these prophets. Because the final chapter of his book is a song, it is sometimes assumed that he was a member of the Tribe of Levi, who served as a musician in Solomon's Temple.

Regardless of which side you are on, please take time to pray for those who are hurting. Lives have been lost. What the world is facing cannot stop us from thanking God for what we have. Feel free to donate through UMCOR.

Thanksgiving Day is coming up very soon. I am inviting each one of us to be generous with our time and money. While we know that we cannot change the situation in the world, it is evident that we can change the face of Storm Lake by investing in our youth. The community is organizing "A Community Thanksgiving Service" on November 19 at 6:00 p.m. in the BVU chapel. We are going to bring our Thanksgiving offering to the Bridge of Storm Lake. Please mark your calendar. From my heart to yours.....



# November 2023


I am featuring three more of the newly purchased books to our library this month. I have ead them all and highly recommend them. There are also MANY new children's books on the table as well as some new adult books on the table and across from the table on shelves labeled "NEW BOOKS". Check a book out this month. I bet you'll enjoy it!!



First new book is "A Man Called Ove" by Fredrik Backman. Ove is a lonely widower who has become a grumpy old man. He is frustrated and doesn't understand the modern world in general. He has staunch principles, a strict routine, and a short fuse. He thinks the world is full of "idiots". Ove's structured quiet world gets a shake up when a young immigrant family moves in next door. An unexpected friendship forms between Ove and the family. Eventually life's interactions with others succeeds in breaking Ove out of his shell by reengaging him with people and life. It is a heartwarming reminder that life is sweeter when it is shared with other people.

The next new book is "The Essential Guide to Children and Separation", surviving divorce and family <u>breakup</u> by Jennifer Croly. Do you know a child affected by divorce? It could be your own child or a grandchild, your niece, nephew, or even one of your students. Divorce is common, but for each child involved, it is a be-wildering and hurtful experience, similar to bereavement yet without the same level of support. This book helps parents and other caregivers understand how children cope with divorce and offers them the tools to support the children in their lives who are struggling under the pressure and confusion of family breakup.





The next new book I want to feature is "The Extraordinary Life of Sam Hell" by Robert Dugoni. Sam Hill was bullied and beaten because he was born with ocular albinism. His mom's strong faith, his dad's wisdom, and his two friends helped him survive his difficult childhood and helped him lead a productive life as a small town eye doctor.


